Located at New Windsor Cantonment State Historic Site



Since 1932, 1.7 million Purple Heart medals have been awarded to America's servicemen and women wounded or lost in combat. The National Purple Heart Hall of Honor preserves the compelling stories of their sacrifice. Listen to the veterans' stories in their own words in the hall's theaters and browse through the electronic Roll of Honor, featuring the names of Purple Heart recipients. Visit the exhibition galleries for a first-hand experience that cannot be conveyed in history books.

From I-84 take exit 7S then follow Route 300 South for 3 miles.
